





Following the close of the capital campaign in 2022, Visiting Nurse will create a Contributor Recognition installation that will be placed across from the nurses' station, the heart of Hospice Home.

Naming Opportunities: There are several naming opportunities available at Hospice Home, including:

Nurses' Station \$150,000	Renovating the "heart of Hospice Home" will allow for more efficient use of space for our staff and a welcoming environment for the families who visit loved ones at Hospice Home. The renovation will include creating additional workstations for our clinical staff, improving the medication room layout and enhancing the look and design of the space.	
Staff Respite Room \$75,000	Currently, Hospice Home staff have a breakroom to use for eating meals and storing their personal items. It is also the only area in which they can step away from their work for a moment of quiet reflection. Our hope is to refresh that space and create a more welcoming, comforting environment for staff to utilize so that they can seek respite and recharge. We would like to equip it with items such as massage chairs and soothing music as well as use aromatherapy diffusers to create an atmosphere that invites revitalization.	
Patient Spa Room \$75,000	We would like to complete the shower room so that patients will have the option of taking a shower while they are at Hospice Home. Currently, if a patient wants to take a shower, they use the family restroom. This space is small and does not easily allow for wheelchairs to access the space safely.	
Patient Rooms \$50,000	In Hospice Home there are 7 of 14 patient rooms that are currently unnamed. Investing in naming a patient room will allow us to update select patient room furniture, refresh paint and enable us to widen some patient room doorframes to allow for easier access for those entering.	





Quiet Room \$25,000	Visiting Nurse believes in caring for individuals of all faiths and beliefs as they face the end of life. The Quiet Room in Hospice Home is a place that allows for spiritual connection. We look forward to refreshing the room with new paint, fixtures, furniture and artwork that expresses inclusivity.
Negative Airflow Ventilation Sγstem \$20,000	To safely care for patients with highly communicable diseases, we would like to create a negative flow air system for two of our patient rooms. This would allow for Hospice Home to safely care for patients who have been diagnosed with COVID-19. Recognition for this will include a plaque located between the two patient rooms that are outfitted with the new negative airflow ventilation system.
Permanent Art Collection \$15,000	We would like to acquire permanent artwork that can adorn the hallway of Hospice Home. Recognition for this will include a plaque located near the artwork installation.
\$1,000 or more	An additional aspect of our anniversary campaign is to create a fund designated for future capital needs. Donors can designate gifts of \$1,000 or more to this fund and will be recognized on a special donor recognition feature in the hallway of Hospice Home.
